This year's editorial staff agreed unanimously to include submissions of creative nonfiction, a genre that combines fact with fictional elements, allowing the storyteller to add an artistic twist to personal experiences. We have changed the structure of the table of contents, mixing poetry and prose, incorporating headings for individual sections, and arranging pieces we believe to be relative to one another in theme, emotion or direction. We are proud of this year's cover, the first to appear in full color. After a quarter-long debate involving surveys and much soul-searching, the question of changing the name of the *Cornfield Review* has been put to rest; after twenty-seven years, the name will remain the same.
